

7.5 There was a highways meeting which the chairman thought was very useful and thanked Colin Hibberd and his team for their hard work, particularly during the adverse weather conditions.

Hampshire County Council is dealing with flooding, but other areas such as Romsey and Basingstoke remain priority at this time. Chairman Wild and Colin Hibberd will look at flooding within the Parish.

Highways are still making good “The Shallows”, along with the neighbouring land owner.

It was agreed during the meeting that Mandy Ware would line mark Pilley High Street and part of Boldre Lane, initially to monitor the successes and gradually phase in other areas subject to the results from monitoring.

The Norley Wood crossroads is due shortly for a review and the clerk will contact the review team for an update

8.00 Amenities – The clerk mentioned that the car park planning application had been returned to her from the National Park Authority, as they want surface level drawings and she will discuss this with Cllr Channell to action.

8.01 Grass cutting – the contractor flagged up that he is likely to go over 12 -14 cuts this year due to the growth rate of the grass – the Clerk had discussed the matter with Cllr Channell and proposed that it be looked at again after the 14th cut as the grass growth rate may slow down again depending on the weather – Resolved

9.00 To confirm council members view on Tanners Lane – It was resolved that the council members as a body agreed that they cannot go any further on the matter, other than to monitor and address parking and access matters

10.00 Broadband – After a heated discussion on the subject, it was resolved that the Council support fast broadband for the community as a whole within the Parish with one abstainer.

11.00 Parish Plan – It was agreed to include flooding, water courses, speed reduction on the A337 Hobbler to Ampress Park and that Cllr’s should look at other items to update for Septembers meeting – Action All

12.00 The Burrard Monument- It was resolved to support the Lymington Society’s restoration of the Monument.

12.00 To receive information from Councillors regarding matters from external meetings – Cllr Bolton attended the New Forest Consultative Panel and was disappointed with the Cycling Charter as the Wiggle event is the same time as the October Drift and Gridiron are doing an event on the same weekend. Cllr Bolton also had a telephone conversation regarding “Our Past, Our Future” lottery funded campaign and supported the training schemes of local people who want rural occupations e.g. ditching, lengthsman scheme and dog exercising centre, which would help reduce numbers in the open forest and other creation and maintenance areas. An important part to consider is the marketing and business skills required which would need to be developed and supported. Cllr Grainger is attending a Hall Committee meeting next week and will speak about having a defibrillator. The Chairman asked if anyone else had any matters and then invited a member of the public to address the council. As this was not a matter on the agenda, the Clerk closed the meeting.
