<u>Guest Speaker</u> – Trevor Wateridge spoke about the forthcoming music festival at The Boldre Club, who would like permission to use the Recreation Ground for camping (tents only) on Friday and Saturday, 4/5 September. Up to 80 people in 30 to 40 tents are expected, pitched on the far (Western) side of the ground. A donation will be made to Boldre Parish Council (BPC). Use of the pavilion is requested for toilets and showers, which would be cleaned by the club after the event. Also, use of the Burnt House Lane gate was requested, but any cars will be kept off of the football pitches. In the event of a football match, campers will stay separate from the footballers. Permission was granted by BPC.

<u>Lees Nursery</u> – Mr Jerry Davies spoke of the decline in the nursery over the last 10 years. No offers have been made for the sites, which employed up to 100 staff at one stage. Lees have now applied for Planning Permission for two new dwellings on the site to include removal of concrete and glass houses. Cllrs Thornber and Channell declared an interest in this item which was discussed by BPC at Item 5 below.
