Would you like to play a part in restoring and enhancing special wildlife sites around the New Forest? If so come and volunteer with us to remove invasive scrub from important species-rich grasslands and heathlands.

Directions will be supplied after booking.

Bring: Lunch, water, sturdy footwear, warm clothes and waterproofs (and if you have them: gardening gloves, loppers and bow saw. Otherwise these will be provided.)

Notes: You will be spending the day using hand tools to remove invasive scrub. Training on use of tools will be provided. Under 18's must be accompanied by an adult.

The **Nature's Stepping Stones Project** is working with landowners to restore grassland, heathland and wetland on privately owned land. Sites of Importance for Nature Conservation (SINCs) are often very small but are important fragments of habitat which help to enable our wildlife to thrive around the edges of the New Forest.
