In summary: OpenReach has currently paused all works in the New Forest due to damage caused to the SSSI/New Forest National Park. The		

			 Pilley/Bull Hill deliverable does involve works in the SSSI. A route forward is being discussed between OpenReach/Natural England/Forestry England. It is not clear on the time frame for resolution. If the timeframe is extended (>12 months) it could be possible to consider community action to implement the works on the SSSI on behalf of OpenReach. The situation is being monitored by BPC. In addition, BPC has requested information on the current Fibre to the Cabinet (FTTC) plan and the cost impact of implementing Fibre to the Premises (FTTP) which will ensure better coverage. This is with HCC, and BPC will continue to monitor.
