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#### SCHEDULE OF PROJECTS COMPLETED

#### A. Maintaining the Parish as an attractive place to live

- In conjunction with Hampshire Highways, tree removed which was blocking the river and repaired the bridge.
- Arranged with Hampshire Highways to paint the bridge at Norleywood watersplash.
- Established an archive of historical material. Encouraged and supported the set-up of Boldre Parish Historical Society.
- Set up regular meetings with Hampshire Highways and a monitored log of all reported defects. Continued to lobby against HGVs. Promoted establishment of Speed Limit Reminders (to be installed 2009) and arranged for black box speed checks by Hampshire Highways.

#### B. Promoted an acceptable ratio of affordable homes

Participated and supported the establishment of this scheme, not yet completed

#### C. Supported community services in the Parishes

- Encouraged use of recreation ground & pavilion by football clubs. Carried out maintenance and painting of pavilion. Improved safety in pavilion. Liaised with Hampshire Probation Service to carry out ground and shrub clearance at recreation ground.
- Replaced some play equipment and improved safety checking of area
- Arranged and ran three exhibitions of historical memorabilia.
- Gave grants to the youth club for roof repairs.
- Gave grants to Boldre outings club.
- Gave grants to local churches for churchyard maintenance.
- Supported retaining village shop/post office and facilitated grants towards refurbishment
- Gave grants to Citizens Advice Bureau

### D. Gave value for money

- Established an improved administrative system together with Council policies and procedures.
- Arranged a local training event for Councillors & Clerks which generated income
- Established a website in conjunction with a local company at zero cost
- Liaised with New Forest National park & commented on their draft proposals
