# **Information for Emergencies**

## At <u>all</u> times individuals must avoid putting themselves or others at risk of injury.

Below are some telephone numbers that may be useful if you recognise an emergency situation and need general or specific assistance, please remember:

When calling for assistance give clear concise information

Provide the precise location of the incident and the cause, damage or injuries involved

Remember the responder may not have any knowledge of the local area

If available to you, use the **What3words** App to relay your location to the responder.

The code to open the box will be provided by the 999 operator who can contact local people trained in its use. Full instructions are also given by the defibrillator when it is switched on.

# Be Prepared:

Emergency situations arise unexpectedly; but making some preparations may help us to cope more effectively:

- 1. Ensure that you have some stocks of easy to prepare or ready-to-eat long-life food for a couple of days to tide you over
- 2. Talk to your neighbours and exchange contact (emergency or next of kin details) and access details (keys, keysafe codes etc.)
- 3. Consider agreeing a mutual support and check up arrangement with your neighbours in the event of an emergency eg if the power is off check your neighbours are coping!
- 4. Think about downloading:
  - a. What3words App to make it easier to provide location details
  - b. Save a Life App to locate defibrillators / for advice on CPR
  - c. SSE Powertrack App for information on power outages in the area

### **Emergency Evacuations**

In some extreme circumstances it may be necessary for the Authorities to require that some areas of the parish or some properties are evacuated. This may be necessary at short notice.

### If you are advised to evacuate your home by the emergency services:

- Turn off electricity, gas and water supplies and unplug all appliances.
- Take your mobile phone and charger.
- Take some spare clothes.
- Take prescribed medication.
- Take cash and credit cards.
- Lock all doors and windows.
- If possible take your pets with you. Otherwise, make sure they are somewhere safe with food & water.

If you leave by car, take bottled water, a duvet or blankets and tune into the local radio for emergency advice and instructions
